**CALL FOR NOMINATIONS FOR SGIM
MID-CAREER EDUCATION MENTORSHIP AWARD**

DESCRIPTION:

This award is intended to recognize the mentoring activities of general medicine educators. The awardee will be recognized at the SGIM Annual Meeting each year that an awardee is chosen.

CRITERIA:

The target candidates are outstanding mid-career clinician educators who are actively engaged in education research and mentorship of junior clinician educators. These junior clinician educators may be residents, fellows, and/or junior faculty, located locally or at a distance. Candidates should be within 15 years of their first faculty appointment, although exceptions to this can be made on a case by case basis. To be eligible to receive the award, nominees must be SGIM members.

The following criteria serve as guidance for nominees for this award:

- The nominee has developed a supportive environment for teaching and scholarship.
- The nominee has demonstrated a commitment to mentorship and established a track record for successful mentorship.
- The nominee provides instruction on teaching skills such as curricular design, teaching methods, and learning and program assessment.
- The nominee is a successful advocate and guide in administrative, organizational, and professional matters for junior clinician educators.
- The nominee demonstrates personal concern for his/her mentees and supports their personal and professional development.
- The nominee values teaching in general internal medicine.
- The nominee demonstrates leadership skills and professionalism.
- The nominee places an equal or greater emphasis on the professional development of his/her trainees than on self-promotion or advancement.

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- Two formal nomination letters, one of which must be from a current or prior mentee, two single-spaced pages or less, stating why this person should receive the SGIM Education Mentorship Award.
- One additional supporting letter may be submitted.
- A current copy of the nominee's curriculum vitae.
- A list of current and prior mentees, their current positions, and their accomplishments.

Mentees are encouraged to submit nominations.
